

General Pack Trip Information

1. Please make reservations early to ensure availability.
2. All trip reservations are made through the Ranch Headquarters Office. Reservation requests must be accompanied by a deposit of 40% of the estimated cost of the trip. When calling or writing please provide the following information:
 - a. Type of trip desired
 - b. Length of trip desired
 - c. Number in your party
 - d. Area to be packed into, if known
3. Reservation forms need to be accurately completed. The information on age, height, weight and riding ability is used to assign riding animals and/or suggest appropriate pack trips, type, length and destination. We reserve the right to refuse service in **any** situation deemed inappropriate, unsafe, or dangerous to our guests or animals.
4. Riders should be a least eight (8) years old to go out on our pack trips (exceptions can be made depending on experience), double riding is not allowed.
5. All guests must assume the risks of horseback riding and sign a release and assumption of risk statement prior to departure.
6. Maximum load limit per pack animal is approximately 150 pounds.
7. There will be extra charges for personal gear weighing more than 50 pounds per person on All Expense Trips.
8. We limit the number of livestock per wrangler to 6 head. Additional pack animals and riding horses require additional wranglers.
9. We have available saddlebags for trail necessities. These can not exceed 6 pounds per horse. It is suggested that large cameras or gear and day packs be packed in your duffel bag or in a safe place on the pack animals.
10. We do not provide sleeping bags, mattresses or pads.
11. Please pack your personal gear, sleeping bags and tents in short sturdy duffel bags. We will “repackage” any gear and/or equipment as needed to fit into our 10” x 15”x 24” pack boxes. We take extraordinary care in packing your equipment and/or personal property; however, we cannot assume any responsibility for loss, damage or breakage on our trips.
12. Trip fee does not include alcoholic beverages or lodging the night preceding or following the trip.
13. Guests should familiarize themselves with back country camping etiquette and conservation of our natural resources. We practice low impact camping concepts.
14. A gratuity is optional and appreciated.
